Imagine you were a child evacuated during WW2. Can you write a diary entry explain what life was like for you in the countryside? You can tea stain the paper to make your entry look older!

Interview a member of your family (or a neighbour) who has a story/ or knows a story about a grandparent or family member during WW2.

Find a WW2 recipe (carrot cookies or wartime stew) and make it at home. Can you write down the recipe and write a review of how it tasted!

Design a propaganda poster to encourage people to help the war effort at home (e.g. grow food, work in factories, not talk to people they don't know)

Please read at least 5 or 6 times a week to an adult and fill in your Reading Record Book. We will monitor this at school.


Can you research the different types of gas masks that were used during WW2. Can you draw and label a diagram of them and explain the different types and when they were used?
