


<p>Imagine you were a child evacuated during WW2. Can you write a diary entry explain what life was like for you in the countryside? You can tea stain the paper to make your entry look older!</p>	<p>Interview a member of your family (or a neighbour) who has a story/ or knows a story about a grandparent or family member during WW2.</p>	<p>Find a WW2 recipe (carrot cookies or wartime stew) and make it at home. Can you write down the recipe and write a review of how it tasted!</p>	<p>Design a propaganda poster to encourage people to help the war effort at home (e.g. grow food, work in factories, not talk to people they don't know)</p> 
<p>Can you build a model Anderson Shelter that people may have had in the gardens during the Blitz? You can use materials such as cardboard, aluminium foil or clay!</p> 	<p>Can you write a newspaper report about the start of WW2? You can choose which country you would like it to be based in.</p> 	<p>Imagine that there was podcasts in WW2. Can you record a podcast about a key event during WW2, such as D Day or the Blitz. Can you use sound effects to make your podcast more interesting?</p> 	<p>READING</p> <p>Please read at least 5 or 6 times a week to an adult and fill in your Reading Record Book. We will monitor this at school.</p>
<p>Can you research the different types of gas masks that were used during WW2. Can you draw and label a diagram of them and explain the different types and when they were used?</p> 	<p>Can you research the main countries that were in WW2? You could colour them in on a blank map of Europe. Can you list each country and write what year they entered the war.</p> 	<p>Can you create a timeline of WW2 and the key events that took place during it. You could include big battles, the Blitz, Pearl Harbour and when certain countries entered the war.</p> 	<p>Complete 4 activities before the end of February and 4 more before our Easter break. Take photographs of the bigger projects and send them to oak@lea-primary.hereford.sch.uk</p> <p>Some of these activities we may also do in class</p>
