### National Curriculum

In English we will continue to write a range of narratives and non-fiction, inking to our topic where possible, including information and explanation writing and also a newspaper article. We will also look at the fiction text of 'Anglo Saxon Boy'. We will work on consistent and appropriate structure and improving our use of paragraphs. We continue to create more detailed writing, using different sentence starts, fronted adverbials and carefully chosen adjectives. We will work to secure our knowledge and use of an increasing range of punctuation and use a range of conjunctions. We will work on improving our understanding of subordinate clauses and we will proofread and amend our writing regularly, using our Purple Polishing Pens!

As Mathematicians; we will continue to practise our tables and Year 4 will take the online 'Tables Check'. We will revisit place value and link that into decimals, measurement and money, including ordering and rounding. We will revisit time, including analogue and digital and 24 hour clock. In statistics, we will interpret charts and line graphs, comparing data. In shape we will interpret and compare angles and different triangles and quadrilaterals. We will also revisit and extend our knowledge of symmetry. We will describe position using co-ordinates and describe movements of shapes on a grid.

As Scientists we will be looking at Keeping Fit and Healthy -Including food and nutrition, different food groups and looking after our body including our teeth. Later this term we will be looking at 'Keeping Fit and Healthy' with a particular focus on the circulatory system our heart and how important exercise is. We will also consider the use of drugs, both from a positive and negative

In Religious Education we will consider for Christians, what was the impact of Pentecost on their lives today? We will also look at how and why people mark the significant events of their life and link this back to important events in a Christian's life, such as baptism and wedding ceremonies.

## National Curriculum

As geographers, we will look at the maps linked to the Anglo Saxon invasion.

As historians, we will use our class timeline to place the Anglo Saxons in relation to other periods of history. We will consider what evidence tells us about the time of the Anglo Saxons and look at their way of life and their beliefs.

As artists, we will develop our sketching, drawing and painting skills to explore Anglo Saxon art, artefacts and jewellery. We will design and make shield and possibly broaches too.

As musicians, we will be having weekly lessons with Miss Gibson, involving singing and learning to play an instrument. We will learn to hold our instrument correctly and learn the finger positions for a range of notes to be able to play some simple tunes.

In DT, we will hopefully explore some Anglo Saxon cooking recipes. It would be great to have some parent help with this later in the term please? Do let us know.

In PSHE, we will be using the Jigsaw scheme focusing on puzzle 5: Relationships which for year 4 includes looking at different types of relationships and how to resolve problems when they arise and for year 5 there is a focus on online relationships and safety. We will also be looking at puzzle 6: Changing **Me** which in year 4 looks at how our bodies change and respecting these changes and for year 5 to understand the changes needed for conception. In PE, outside on Tuesdays, we will be developing our small ball skills linking to tennis skills. We will also be looking at developing our athletic skills. On Thursday's with Mr Dixon Gough we will be developing our cricket and rounders skills. In Computing, we will be continuing to develop our

computational thinking through an introduction to coding. We will be using codeclubworld.org. We will also be developing our internet safety and cybersecurity skills through the NCSC developed Cyber Sprinters resource.
