Art

Design, make and evaluate a shaduf after investigating how they work.

Discover what foods the ancient Egyptians would have eaten and follow a recipe to make Egyptian bread.

<u>Science</u>

Identify how sounds are made.

Find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it.

Recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear.

Recognise that sound travels better through solids than through gases.

Investigate pitch.

Recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.

Investigate the best materials for absorbing sound.
